- Assisting in the development of the schoolwide needs assessment.
- Ways to make parents aware of the importance of regular school attendance.
- Each ELAC shall have the opportunity to elect at least one member to the District English Learner Advisory Committee (DELAC). Districts with 31 or more ELACs may use a system of proportional or regional representation.

Parent members of the ELAC are expected to:

- attend all 4 meetings
- learn about the SPSA through trainings and information shared at ELAC meetings;
- represent EL parents in the neighborhood and community; and
- actively participate in ELAC responsibilities
